




## **Our Recent Experience:**

- 8% decline in Potentially Preventable Admissions and 9% decline in Potentially Preventable Readmissions among cohort of Medicare managed care patients from 2009 through 2011.
- Recent snapshot of Severe Diabetic Patients managed by Montefiore had a 7.8% lower rate of Emergency Room visits compared to those unmanaged.

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## Montefiore's Pioneer ACO: Population Profile:

#### 23,250 Original Beneficiaries

- · 8,000 dual eligible for both Medicare and Medicaid
- 9% of this patient population = 55% of costs



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## **Program Profile:**

- Montefiore is the only Pioneer ACO in New York State.
- Led the nation in savings
  - 3% of total beneficiaries and 16% of total savings
  - 7% reduction in cost below our benchmark
- Network includes 3100 providers
  - Participation is growing
- Biggest change=70% had private practice MDs.
  - · Refined our risk stratification approach
  - Engaged MDs
- One of four Pioneers to have the most upside/downside risk by Year 3.
- Goal = Full Capitation.

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**Program Profile:** 

Met all mandatory quality reporting requirements, and was successful on a number of metrics:

- Inpatient admissions <u>decreased</u> by 10.4%
- Uncontrolled Diabetes: Inpatient admissions <u>decreased</u> by 45.7%
- Congestive Heart Failure: Inpatient admissions <u>declined</u> by 5.6%
- All cause readmissions declined by 35.5%
- 82% of Pioneer ACO patients gave their doctors overall performance the maximum score available (as compared to a national average of 79%)

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
