SARA R. COLLINS, PhD, is vice president for Affordable Health Insurance at The Commonwealth Fund. An economist, Dr. Collins joined The Fund in 2002 and has led The Fund's national program on health insurance since 2005. Since joining The Fund, Dr. Collins has led several national surveys on health insurance and authored numerous reports, issue briefs and journal articles on health insurance coverage and policy. She has provided invited testimony before several congressional committees and subcommittees. Prior to joining The Fund, Dr. Collins was associate director/senior research associate at the New York Academy of Medicine, Division of Health and Science Policy. Earlier in her career, she was an associate editor at U.S. News & World Report, a senior economist at Health Economics Research, and a senior health policy analyst in the New York City Office of the Public Advocate. She holds an A.B. in economics from Washington University and a Ph.D. in economics from George Washington University.

ARNOLD EPSTEIN, MD, deputy assistant secretary for planning and evaluation at the US Department of Health and Human Services, oversees a staff of 40 professionals who study a broad range of health-related issues to advise the Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation and the Secretary of HHS on all health matters. Before assuming his current position in March 2014, Dr. Epstein served as chairman of the Department of Health Policy and Management at the Harvard University School of Public Health, where he was the John H. Foster Professor. Dr. Epstein's research interests focus on quality of care and access to care for disadvantaged populations. His book, Falling Through the Safety Net, Insurance Status and Access to Health *Care*, won the Kulp Wright Award by the American Risk and Insurance Association in 1994. During 1993-1994, Dr. Epstein worked in the White House where he had staff responsibility for policy issues related to the health care delivery system, especially quality management. He was vice chair of the Institute of Medicine Committee on Developing a National Report on Health Care Quality, and co-chair of the Performance Measurement Coordinating Committee of the Joint Commission on the Accreditation of Health Care Organizations (JCAHO), the National Committee on Quality Assurance and the American Medical Association. He has served as chairman of the Board of AcademyHealth and vice chair of the Board of the Center for Health Care Strategies. He has served on several editorial boards including Health Services Research and the Annals of Internal Medicine and was formerly associate editor for health policy at the New England Journal of Medicine. He has been elected to the American Society for Clinical Investigation, the American Association of Professors, and the Institute of Medicine.

RICHARD ONIZUKA, PhD, is chief executive officer of the Washington Health Benefit Exchange. Dr. Onizuka was assistant director for health policy for the Washington State Health Care Authority (HCA) for over nine years, where he was responsible for programs and initiatives related to Governor Gregoire's five point plan to improve quality and cost efficiency in Washington's health care system, and also served as the State Health Information Technology (HIT) Coordinator. Prior to his service to the State of Washington, he spent over eight years as a manager and clinic administrator with Kaiser Permanente in Colorado. He has a PhD in Clinical Psychology from the University of Kentucky, and is a licensed psychologist. **LINDA SHEPPARD, JD**, is special counsel and director of Health Policy and Analysis for the Kansas Insurance Department. She most recently served as special counsel and director of health care policy and analysis, as well as project manager for the department's implementation of the insurance provisions in the Affordable Care Act. Prior to rejoining the insurance department in April 2008, Ms. Sheppard was deputy attorney general for the Consumer Protection/Antitrust Division of the Office of the Kansas Attorney General. She also previously served as assistant general counsel for the Kansas Insurance Department and, prior to joining the Department, was in private practice with the law firm of Shughart Thomson & Kilroy in Kansas City, Missouri. Ms. Sheppard received her Bachelor of Science in Business Administration and her Juris Doctorate from the University of Kansas. She is admitted to practice in the states of Missouri and Kansas, and recently joined the staff of the Kansas Health Institute as Senior Analyst and Strategy Team Leader for Health Care Reform.

TIMOTHY STOLTZFUS JOST, JD, holds the Robert L. Willett Family Professorship of Law at the Washington and Lee University School of Law. He is a coauthor of a casebook, Health Law, used widely throughout the United States in teaching health law and now in its seventh edition.
