Growing Interest in Affordable Health Care for All

- Numbers of uninsured have grown from 40 million in 2000 to 47 million in 2005
- Growing financial squeeze on middle class
- New York Times poll confirms health insurance coverage is high on the public's agenda
- Numerous proposals have been introduced in Congress 2005–2007
- President Bush made a new strategy for health insurance coverage a key feature of his State of the Union address and budget
- Presidential candidates are beginning to advance proposals
- Governors are stepping up to the plate



Commonwealth Fund Report Released Today

- Analysis of major Congressional and Administration health insurance reform proposals over 2005-2007 in three broad categories:
 - Fundamental reforms of insurance system
 - Expansions of public insurance programs
 - Strengthening employer-based coverage
- Lewin Group used its microsimulation model to generate coverage and cost estimates
- Health Policy R&D developed side-by-side analyses of Congressional bills
- First of two part series: Part II will analyze proposals to improve quality and efficiency




