




Arkansas Health System Improvement

Arkansas Health Care Independence Program

- Alternative to Medicaid expansion (commonly called "Private Option")
- Not managed care or traditional premium assistance – utilizes premium assistance
- Use Medicaid funding to purchase private coverage through the Health Insurance Marketplace for those <139% FPL
- Qualified high value silver-level policies
- Essential health benefits with private provider payment rates




Arkansas Health Care Independence Program

- Funding via Affordable Care Act
- Majority of newly insured placed with private carriers; medically frail better served in traditional Medicaid
- Some existing Medicaid beneficiaries moved reducing size of state program
- Required waiver of select federal Medicaid requirements
- Bipartisan support with 75% approval required for appropriation each year




Potential Health Insurance Distribution

Number of Issuers Offering Individual Plans by Service Area





Arkansas Demonstration Waiver Evaluation Hypotheses

- HCIP beneficiaries will have equal or better <u>access to health care</u> compared with what they would have otherwise had in the Medicaid fee-for-service system over time.
- 2. HCIP beneficiaries will have equal or better <u>care and</u> <u>outcomes</u> compared with what they would have otherwise had in the Medicaid fee-for-service system over time.
- 3. HCIP beneficiaries will have better <u>continuity of care</u> compared with what they would have otherwise had in the Medicaid fee-for-service system over time.
- 4. Services provided to HCIP beneficiaries will prove to be *cost effective*.

Arkansas health insurance premiums have nearly doubled in ten years and the rate of uninsurance is nearly 40% among working-age Arkansans in some of our rural counties. At the same time, more than half of our adult citizens suffer from at least one chronic disease. Is it any wonder that Arkansas hospitals have experienced an increase of more than 50% in the cost of uncompensated care?

With one of the lowest median household incomes in the country -- \$38,413 -- Arkansas stands to benefit significantly from an expansion of health care coverage via the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act. In fact three-fourths of all Arkansas families have income at or below a level that will make them eligible for help in getting coverage under the federal health care law -- either through federal subsidies or the potential Medicaid expansion. This is the highest percentage of families in the entire U.S. who will qualify for this help. The national average is 68% of families earning at or below 400% of Federal Poverty Level (FPL).
