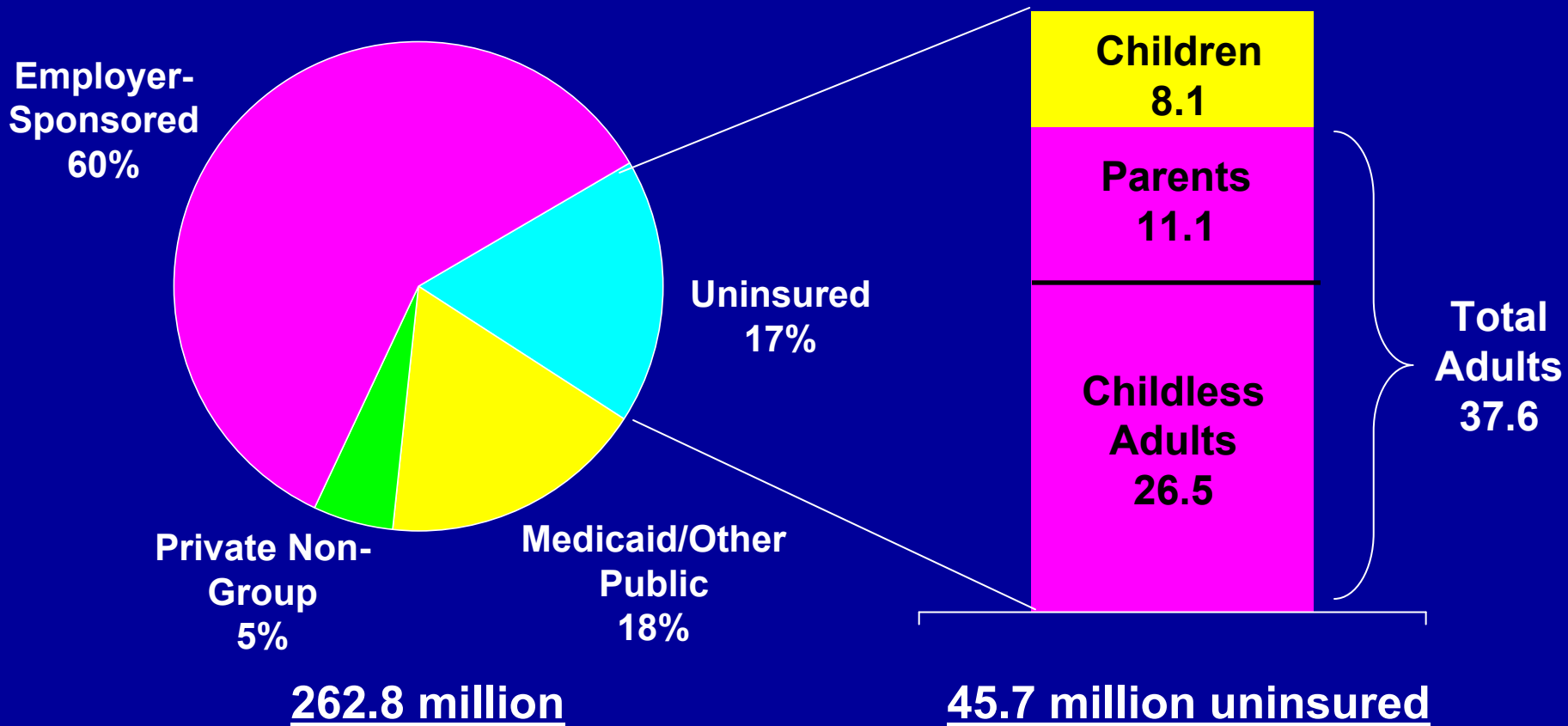

Health Insurance Coverage of the Nonelderly Population, 2008

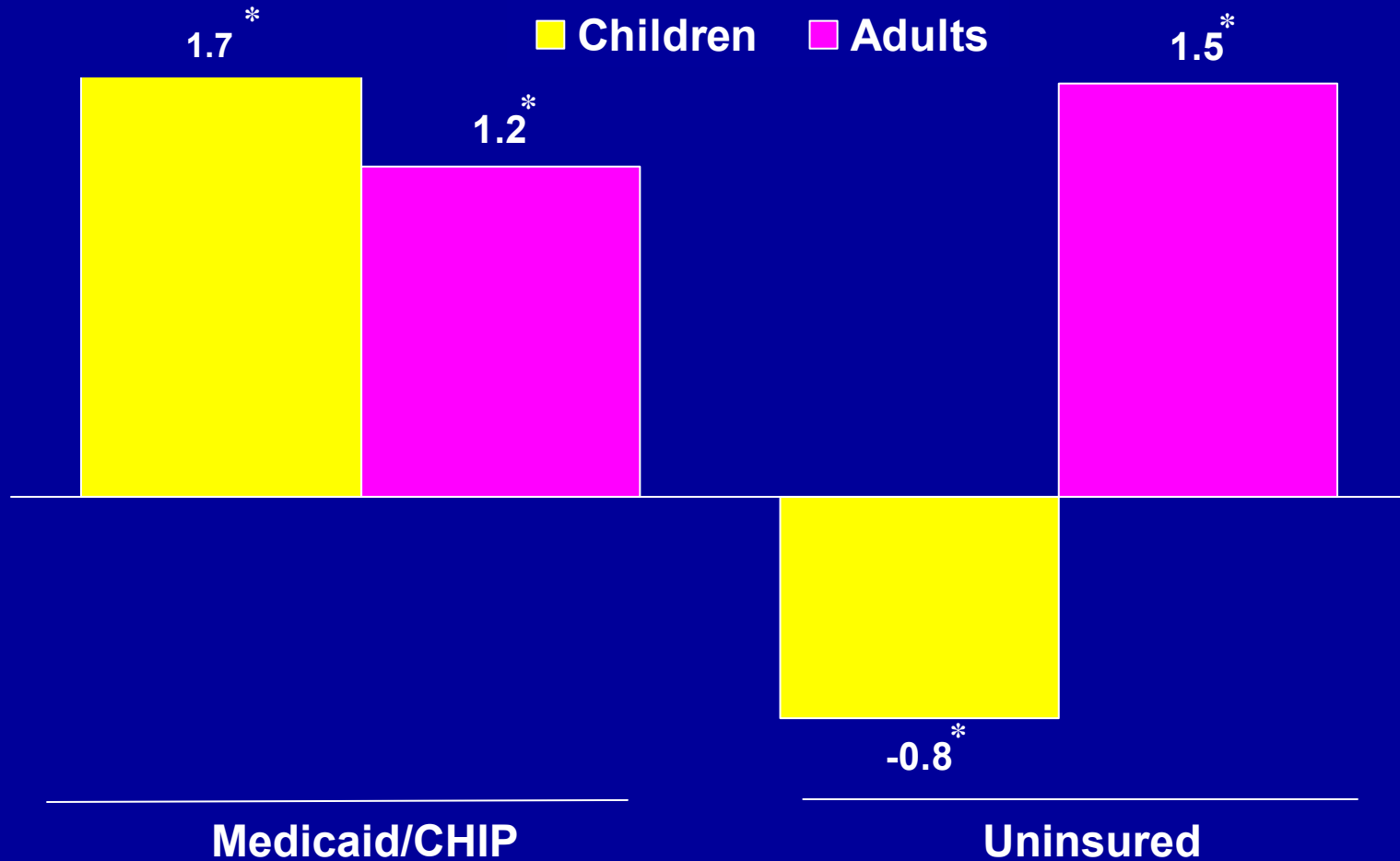


Medicaid/Other Public includes: Medicaid, CHIP, other state programs, Medicare, and military-related coverage.

Change in Coverage for Nonelderly, 2007 – 2008 (Millions of Americans)



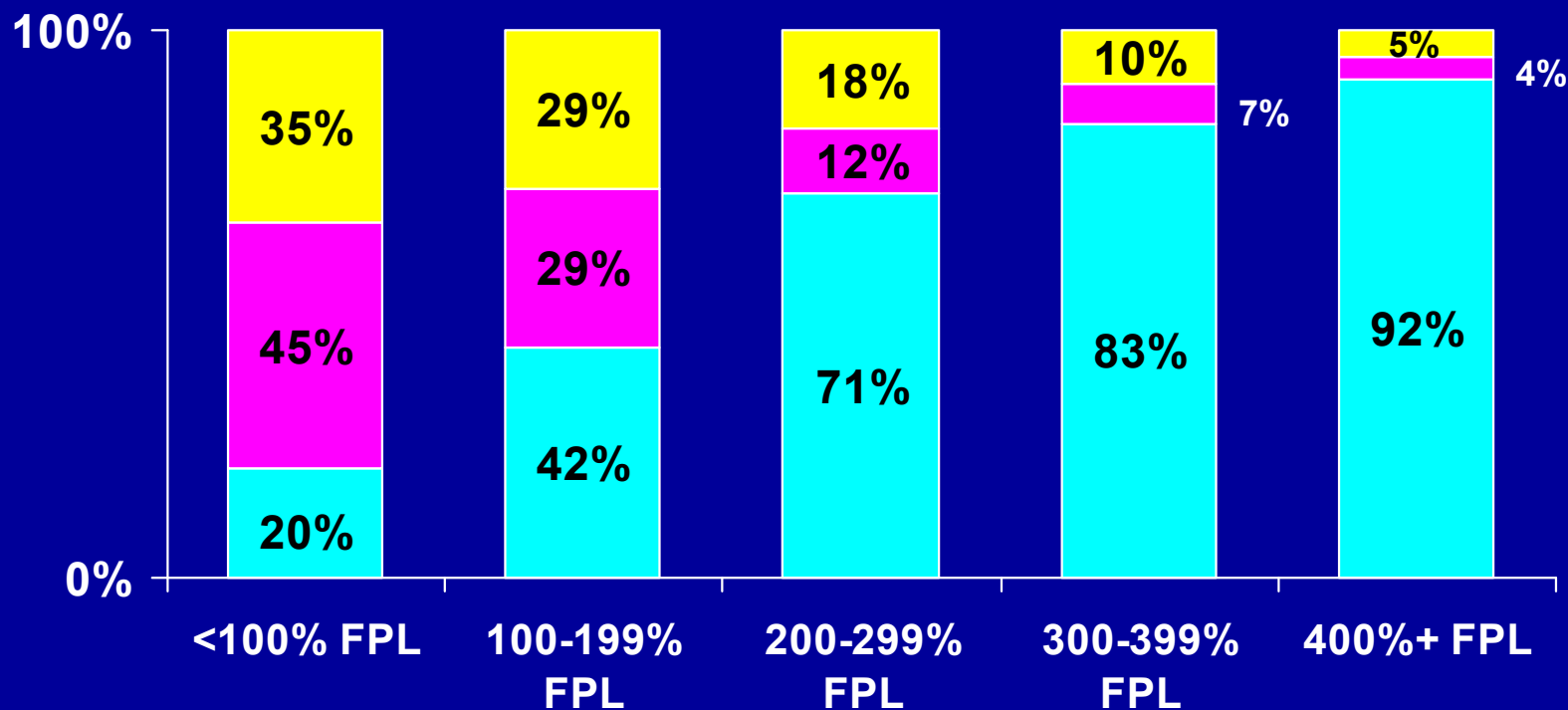

■ Employer/Other Private ■ Medicaid/Other Public ■ Uninsured



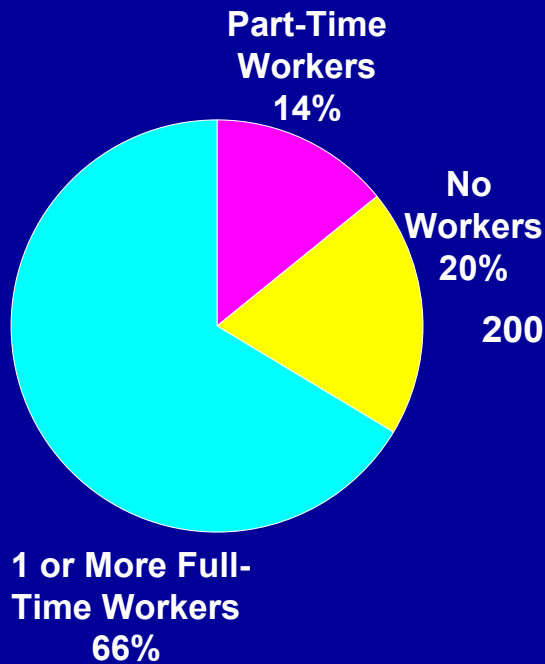

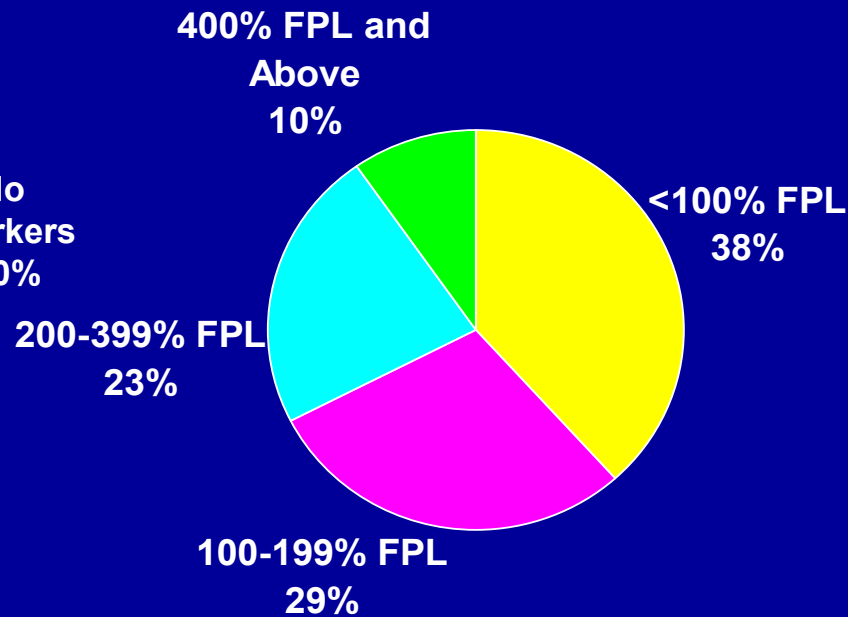

Characteristics of the Uninsured, 2008

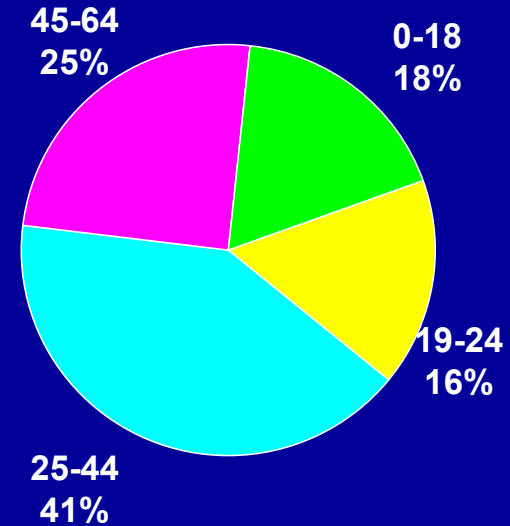
Family Work Status



Family Income



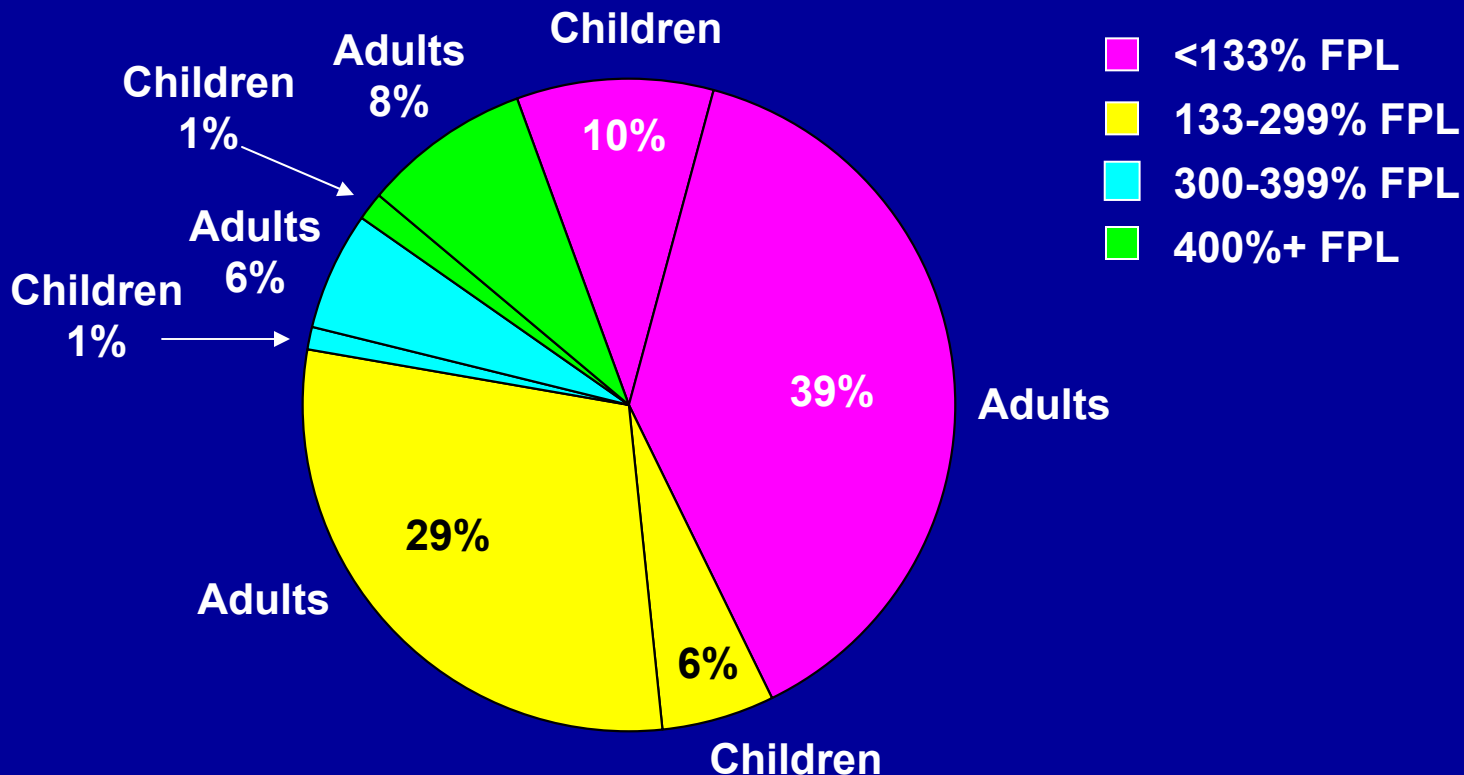

Nonelderly Uninsured by Poverty Levels and Age, 2008

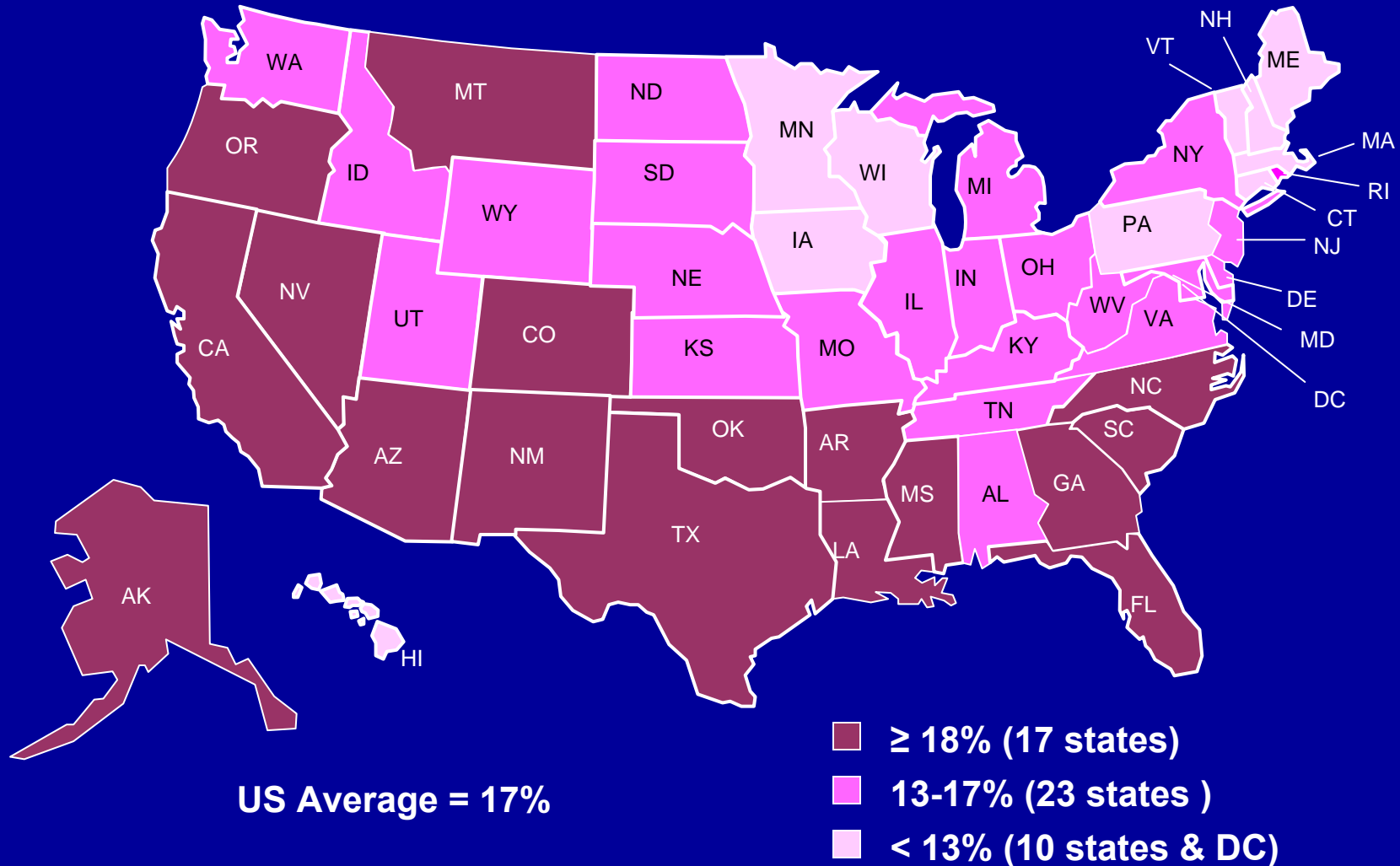
