
#### The Opening Lineup

- Starting somewhere, even if first base is in left field
- Value & accountability
- Baseline for future assessment of relative progress
- Limits of data and measures
- Correlation vs. causation
- A small step toward tentative findings; a giant leap toward policy conclusions

## Technically Speaking

- Floating baselines and moving pockets
- Don't be distracted by the "scores"
- To vary is human; to discover it is not divine
- Objects in the rear view mirror are less clear than they appear
- Example: Mortality (possibly) amenable to health care


# Now Pitching "The Business of Health"

# U.S. Health Care in Perspective Different Paths to Progress

- Remember how we got here
- Reforms:

Transparency, accountability, portability, expanded time horizon, targeted subsidies, value-based competition, patient engagement, shared decision making

- Efficiency first, to afford and then focus better on targeted equity
- Trial and error; supply & demand interaction
